With Your Help, We Did It!

It was the morning after the CEYC Bellbridge community had celebrated a successful end-of-year party at Roy Williams Reserve that someone typed the words ... "Is this true?" At the very time the party was taking place, The Border Mail had published the shock announcement that our much loved, and desperately needed, childcare and kindergarten facility was to be closed down (along with six other local services in the region) just three weeks prior to Christmas. This definitely was not the Christmas present we were all expecting.

In true country community form, we did what we knew best. We banded together to fight! Social media forums were abuzz with constant communication suggesting what we needed to do to keep our centre, and the six others afloat. We promptly created a Facebook page to communicate with everyone affected by the shocking revelation that we no longer had before and after school care, or a kindergarten, for our children. Our first port of call was contacting local MP, Cathy McGowan, to see what could be done at a federal level. A petition was established calling for more regional support for rural childcare services and, within a week, this petition was signed by over 300 people.

Ms McGowan was very proactive in representing our cause. She was inundated with emails, phone calls and face-to-face discussions over the course of the weekend. During Question Time the following Monday, she presented our desperate situation to the House. She put forth our plight, seeking answers to the shock announcement. Consequently, she managed to convene a roundtable discussion with relevant stakeholders. Two weeks later, at The Cube in Wodonga we held a very productive meeting with federal, state and local politicians who, to their credit, listened openly and responded swiftly to our needs. Department of Education representative, the Hon Craig Laundy MP, and his team were very sympathetic to the predicament we were in and understood the need for haste. We were a week out from Christmas and still unsure if we had childcare facilities for the coming year, let alone a kindergarten service. For many of us, that

meant uncertainty surrounding our work situations going into 2019, with few employers appreciating small children biting at the heels. However, the meeting raised our hopes as shire councillors, local childcare providers and community members all had the opportunity to share their concerns regarding the closures, seek alternative arrangements and hear those magical words that the government was offering to provide additional funding to ensure services remained open.

Meanwhile, the media was keen to follow the conversations. We engaged the support of local radio programs, regional news stations and any social media forum we could hijack. Our own 'Save Rural Education' Facebook page served as a valuable platform for discussion and call to action. The message was clear these facilities are essential to rural areas. A theme that was prominent throughout all discussions was the flowon effect the imminent closures would have on our community. The principals from Bethanga Primary School and Talgarno Primary School were both very concerned about enrolment numbers. No before and after school care facilities would mean the withdrawal of many students with working parents. No kindergarten would mean families being forced to move their children into town to seek such services and a greater likelihood of them remaining in town for future schooling. No childcare would mean young families no longer seeing the area as an attractive and viable option. This, in turn, would see low growth in our community affecting local business, future infrastructure and the rare spirit of 'community' that seems so lost in our modern world.

Then, at the last minute, a Christmas miracle happened! Days before the centre was scheduled to close its doors forever, Towong Shire Council agreed to take over the service. The relief and jubilation that emanated from all involved was palpable. Still unsure what it all meant, we were just so relieved and grateful that, come 2019, our children had a place to learn, grow, socialise and play.

Now, two months on, the newly-named Bellbridge Early Years Learning Centre has once again become the hub

for young families within our community. It really is a terrific outcome for our region and highlights the collaborative efforts between community members and local, state and federal government.

We would like to shout out a big THANK YOU to everyone in the community and beyond, for their help in ensuring we have a childcare and kindergarten facility in the area. Whether you signed the petition, wrote, emailed or lobbied our local councillors, state or federal representatives, we are most appreciative of your support and assistance. Retaining one of the key local services in the area will ensure that new families are attracted to our beautiful region.

Spread the Word

If anyone is interested in using the Bellbridge Early Years Learning Centre, it is open from 7.30am to 6.00pm Monday to Friday for Long Day Care. A funded kindergarten program runs for four year olds on Wednesdays and Fridays (9.00-4.30) and for three year olds on Friday mornings (9.00am-12.30pm) during Victorian school terms.



Towong Healthy Communities Plan 2018-2021 Adopted

The *Towong Healthy Communities Plan 2018-2021* was formally adopted at the February Council meeting in Tallangatta this week.

Developed in consultation and collaboration with health services and providers across the region, feedback for the Plan was overwhelmingly positive.

The adopted Plan outlines priorities and activities to be delivered across the Shire over the next three years and includes a series of initiatives across five priority areas:

- · Healthier Eating
- Active Living
- Reducing Harmful Alcohol and Drug Use
- Improving Mental Health
- Family Violence

Mayor Cr David Wortmann said the plan is critical to the delivery of Council services and provides a clear framework for the delivery of initiatives to improve the health of Towong Shire community members.

"It's great to hear from the community that we're focusing on the right things, and that they support the approach we're taking when it comes to the health of our community," he said.

Help shape the future of Maternal and Child Health Services in Towong Shire

Towong Shire Council is seeking community input into a review of Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Services across the Shire. The review aims to ensure that the service continues to meet community needs while operating efficiently and effectively.

The Maternal and Child Health Service works with families to care for babies and young children. The service helps families to monitor their child's growth and development in a series of one-on-one consultations at specific times in a child's early years. The service is

currently offered at Bellbridge, Corryong, Mitta Mitta, Tallangatta and Walwa.

Feedback about family circumstances and expectations for the service will be gathered via an online survey. The online survey closes on 28 February and can be found on Council's website.

Parents can also provide more detailed feedback in person via the following informal Coffee and Chat sessions:

Towong Shire Mayor Cr David Wortmann said the aim of the review is to look at how well the service currently operates and identify potential opportunities to deliver the service differently both now and into the future.

"As a parent myself I understand the importance of support for children and their parents," Councillor Wortmann said. "Gathering feedback as part of this review really helps us to understand how we might best provide value for our community members."

Council seeks input from community members on budget decisions

Council is seeking community insights to inform how they collaborate with residents and community members on financial decision making.

Council will hold discussion forums across the Shire in March. These sessions will explore how Council and community members can work together to make decisions that best serve the needs of the Towong Shire community.

Mayor David Wortmann says Council wants to be clear and open about Council finances and budget processes and to work with community members to make good decisions.

"Council is always looking for smarter ways to spend our funding to ensure the needs of the community are being met as best as possible. We know our community members hold a great deal of first-hand experience when it comes to the needs of the Shire as a whole," he said. "We want to understand how people prefer to be consulted when it comes to financial decision making. It is part of a long term shift to having our community members more involved in these big decisions."

Cr Wortmann says it makes sense to sit down with community members to find out. "They're the experts after all."




Rainfall Round-up

The summer rainfall (November to end January 2019) was 171 mm at TAFCO station (de Hennin's) but only 128 mm at Hume Reservoir! So we can take our pick about how it compares with the past. The reading of 128 mm for Hume Reservoir was 7% below the median or 16% below average (149 mm). November and December were both very close to the median but January's 17 mm was 43% below the median. We fared better than most of Victoria where the January rainfall was 90% below median for many places.

The big difference between the readings at Hume and TAFCO shows how flukey summer rainfall can be and we have certainly seen this over recent months. (If enough people want to send me their monthly rainfall figures I could put together a district rainfall map each edition).

The total rainfall for 2018 was 442 mm at Hume Reservoir and 452 mm at TAFCO compared with an average of 698 mm. So we received about two thirds of our average rainfall. Both our autumn and spring were well below average and it was only in early summer that we had more than average rainfall.



The temperatures this summer were above average and across the state records were set in both November and January. (The mean temperature for Hunters Hill in January was almost 5 degrees above average).

The Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) had suggested that summer rainfall would be about average so they were about right --it turned out better than average at TAFCO and slightly worse at Hume.

We all know that there tends to be cycles in our weather and I looked at the annual rainfall (Hume Reservoir) since 1922 and compared each year with the long term average and found the following pattern.

1922-'33	Very Dry	10 out of 12 years
1934-'36	Wet	3 out of 3 years
1937-'45	Very dry	7 out of 8 years
1946-'56	Wet	8 out of 11 years
1957-'68	Average	7 dry and 5 wet
1969-'75	Very wet	6 out of 7 years
1976-'82	Dry	5 out of 7 years
1983-'96	Very wet	12 out of 14 years
1997-'09	Dry	10 out of 13 years
2010-'18	Average	4 dry and 5 wet

This is just a reminder that the weather goes in cycles – and I'm just hoping that we may be due for a Very wet cycle soon!

Prospects for autumn (February to end April)

BOM is saying that there is no strong signal for rainfall above or below average for southern Australia this autumn. (So we can hope for around 125 mm which is the median). The ENSO is still neutral but there is a 50% chance that an El Niño may develop in late autumn/ winter so we need to watch this. (Only 3 out of 8 models are forecasting an El Niño so that is encouraging). The IOD is neutral and has little impact on weather over this period but again some models suggest a positive IOD (meaning less rain) after July. According to the Fast Break, the prospects for the next six months are average to slightly drier and as a glass half full person I'm going with that.

Making the Invisible Visible

Heart disease is the No. 1 killer of women in the Australia but women often mistake the symptoms for less life-threatening conditions like acid reflux, the flu or normal aging. There are still many women who are shocked that they could be having a heart attack.

We've all seen the movie scenes where a man gasps, clutches his chest and falls to the ground, but a heart attack victim could easily be a woman, and the scene may not be that dramatic.

Although men and women can experience chest pressure that feels like an elephant sitting across the chest, women can experience a heart attack without chest pressure.

Many women think the signs of a heart attack are unmistakable but in fact they can be subtler and sometimes confusing.

- 1. Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain in the centre of your chest. It lasts more than a few minutes or goes away and comes back.
- 2. Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- 3. Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort. Other signs such as breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or light-headedness.

As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting and back or jaw pain.

If you feel any of the above symptoms, we recommend following these steps:

Stop

Rest immediately.

Talk

Tell someone how you feel. If you take angina medicine:

- 1. Take a dose of your medicine
- 2. Wait 5 minutes.
- 3. Still have symptoms? Take another dose of your medicine.

Wait 5 minutes.

Call 000

Call 000 if your symptoms are severe, getting worse or

have lasted for 10 minutes.

- Ask for an ambulance
- Don't hang up

Wait for the operator's instructions.

While on the phone, chew 300mg aspirin, unless you have an allergy to aspirin or if your doctor has told you not to take it.

Bethanga Brigade attended a Water pump smoking, which did not spread any fire to the surrounding grass, meaning the incident was quickly under control.

22nd January 3:28pm Smoke sighting, Wises Creak Road Talgarno.

Bethanga appliances attended a grass and scrub fire and assisted Talgarno brigade in bringing the incident under control.

22nd January 4:29pm Smoke sighting, Kurrajong Gap Road Bethanga.

Bethanga Tanker 2 left the scene at Wises Creek to attend the smoke sighting. Crews investigated and reported that this job was a false alarm.

24th **January 1:37pm** Grass and scrub fire, Murray River Road Bungil.

Bethanga Tanker 1 responded to assist Granya, who was also supported by 9 other brigades. A second crew travelled to Granya at 8pm and relieved the crew on Bethanga Tanker 1, before staying overnight to assist with extinguishing the fire and making the scene safe.

24th January 2:58pm Car accident, Murray River Road near Granya.

Bethanga Tanker 2 was called to manage this incident as all closer appliances were already occupied with the fire at Bungil. Bethanga Tanker 2 assisted emergency crews in making the area safe for traffic before proceeding to the Bungil fire to assist.

4th February 8.12am Tree on fire, Retallicks Lane Talgarno.

Bethanga Tanker 1 attended a tree on fire, started by lightning from the day beforehand. Luckily the fire had not spread to the surrounding grass and was easily managed by the crew.

5th February 2:51am Grass and scrub fire, Tallangatta South.

Members turned out in Bethanga Tankers 1 and 2 to support Old Tallangatta. The situation was managed by personnel on scene, and both trucks were returned to station before arriving on scene.

STRIKE TEAMS

Bethanga appliances have been sent on a number of strike teams over the last few months to support brigades in the wider area. When we are sent on Strike Teams, only one of our 3 appliances responds. We have assisted at the following fires:

Possum Point Fire near Corryong. Berringama fire near Corryong twice.

UHF CHANNEL 24

Talgarno, Bethanga and Granya stations and appliances use UHF Channel 24 for communications. Members with private appliances also switch to UHF 24 for the duration of an incident. We encourage the general public to use this channel to communicate with the brigade to assist them with incident information. Exact location and best access is important information for us.





CFA FIRE RESTRICTIONS

In Towong Shire, the Fire restrictions are set to end on the 1st of May. This may change depending on conditions, so make sure you check on the CFA website before lighting a fire.

We often attend fires out of control after the fire restrictions have ended.

A reminder that the person lighting the fire is still responsible to ensure it does not get out of control, so please assess the conditions and have adequate fire fighting equipment and capable personnel to ensure it stays in control.

Fires that do not comply with the rules or accidentally escape are viewed very seriously by Police.

COUNCIL FIRE RESTRICTIONS FOR OPEN FIRES

In addition to the CFA restrictions, Towong Shire Council has restrictions on lighting fires depending on the zone you live in. Some of the restrictions are all year round, so it is important to know which zone you live in and what the restrictions are for that zone.


