


Water, water everywhere

The following is an extract from the Murray-Darling Basin Authority River Murray Weekly Report (for the week ending 17 August 2016).

Stream flows in the upper Murray tributaries have continued to recede given there was little rainfall over the last week. The flow in the Mitta Mitta River at Hinnomunjie has reduced to 1,400 ML/day whilst the upper Murray at Biggara has decreased to 1,700 ML/day. On the Ovens River, the flow at Wangaratta fell from 12,300 ML/day to 7,500 ML/day.

Whilst inflows have receded over the last week the upper catchments are still very wet and further rainfall could see rises in the tributaries. There has been a significant turnaround in River Murray system inflows in the last four months.

Inflows were in the lowest 2% of historical records for the month of April but have since risen to be in the wettest 18% of July records.

At Dartmouth Reservoir, the storage volume increased by 20 GL to 2,150 GL (56% capacity). The release from Dartmouth is currently 1,200 ML/day due to the release of entitlement water for hydroelectricity generation.

At Hume Reservoir, the storage volume increased by 129 GL to 2,475 GL (82% capacity). As storage levels rise over the coming weeks, the MDBA may soon commence 'airspace management' releases aimed at providing a measure of flood protection, balanced against ensuring Hume fills prior to demand emerging and maximising water availability.

The MDBA operates Hume Dam in accordance with arrangements agreed by the joint governments of the Commonwealth, New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia. These are outlined within a set of Objectives and Outcomes and state that the order of priority for dam operations is:

- Firstly, protect the security of assets (e.g. Hume Dam);
- Secondly, to maximise the available water at the end of the relevant flooding episode;
- Thirdly, subject to the foregoing items, limit flood damage to downstream communities and increase benefits to the environment and public amenity.

Given recent inflows and rainfall predictions, it is *likely* that Hume Reservoir will fill. However, it is not yet *assured* that the dam will fill and historical records show that conditions can quickly turn dry. The primary role of Hume Dam is water conservation.

Calling for Hay Donations

The Burrumbuttock Hay Runners are planning another trip to deliver hay to drought-stricken communities in January 2017. This time, Yaraka, 220 km south of Longreach in QLD, will receive donations of hay and other provisions to ease the pressure. With all the rain we have had here it is easy to forget that parts of Queensland are still in drought. Some recent rain has meant dams have filled and the growth of some short term feed, but it is still too early to determine the extent to which the drought has been relieved.

Jono Green of Talgarno will again be taking a load of hay North as part of the January 2016 Hay Run. Greenfreight are once again donating the use of a truck and trailer. If you are likely to have a couple of bales of

hay spare this season which you would be willing to donate, please contact Jono Green on 0422 965 024. Donations can also be made to the Rotary Club of Sydney as they handle all monetary donations on the behalf of Burrumbuttock Hay Runners. (To get an idea of the costs involved, each truck uses about \$2,000 worth of fuel).

Bec's Banter

So, so many things to prepare for spring, such exciting times, with all this moisture in our soils.

Mulching with organic matter, compost and manures in the next month or so will be vital. Just check around the collar/trunk of any newer or newly planted trees, as 'rot' could become an issue with this moisture and warmer weather coming up.

Feeding your fruit trees and entire garden with organic fertilisers and manures before mulching over the next month will also carry your garden through the hot summer as well as boosting some spring growth.

Pruning all your salvias and perennials now will set them up for a fabulous spring/summer display.

There is still time to plant bare rooted trees and or potted trees.

Start thinking about what spring/summer plants you might like to add to your garden. Make a list, then go to your local nursery and put in an order.

Thinking about using any vertical spaces in your garden? I have just planted some different types of deciduous vines – Boston Ivy and Virginia creeper as well as the Ornamental grape. All of these plants are related and come from the 'Vitaceae' family. There are several varieties available. They are all woody, deciduous vines with fabulous autumn colour, as well as growing a lot like a 'triffod' if you give them the conditions they need. So be prepared to do some initial pruning to get them nice and strong, then they are virtually 'unkillable'for the best results try to have the foliage in full sun or at

least for as long in the sun as possible.

So bung one of these vines in to cover an old fence, tank or dead tree - they look amazing.

I've also had a whole lot of fun researching, ordering and planting dwarf Apple and Pear trees that I will espalier.

Give your citrus a good feed as it finishes up fruiting. Once the frosts are out of the way, have a good look at your citrus and give them a tidy up, prune and air out the middle of the tree if possible by pruning all the inward growing branches and pruning out any dead or damaged foliage. A good mulch as the soil warms up would be fabulous too.



I'm still totally 'nuts' over Alstroemeria and now have approx. six different types and colours. If you would like some, just pop in and I'll bag some up for you.

Prospects for the Season Ahead



Rainfall Round-up

Well it seems like we've had enough rain for some to be complaining but most agree there's money in mud.

The winter rainfall (May to end July) was 326 mm, 72% above the median (189 mm) and 60% above the average (204 mm). Each month was above average. It was like an old-fashioned winter with 55 days of rain or almost two thirds of the days. Although I thought it seemed colder than usual both the daily maximum and minimum were actually above average. This is a continuation of the trend for the whole year with April being close to the hottest on record. Australia-wide, the period May to July was Australia's third wettest on record although that was not the case for our district.



The Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) outlook suggested that we could expect above average rainfall and this time they were right. May brought strong cold fronts and strong westerly winds with some very high daily rainfall totals. June continued this pattern as well as several east coast lows that contributed high totals although not so much in NE Victoria. More recently, the sub-tropical high pressure ridge has been further north than normal and this has allowed the rain-bearing fronts to keep moving into northern Victoria. This is in contrast with those years where the promising rain slips away to the south.

For the year to date our rainfall (489 mm) is about 24% above average (393 mm) and 51% above the median (324 mm). Even with average rainfall from here on we will be above average for the full year.

Prospects for Spring (August to end October)

A La Niña event has not developed as yet even though there has been some movement towards one with cooler water in the Pacific. At this stage the ENSO is still in the neutral range although getting closer to a La Niña. BOM is saying that there is still a 50/50 chance of a La Niña this year but they suggest if it does occur it may be weak with little impact on rainfall.

The strongly negative Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) has continued, however and it is expected that this will remain at least to the end of spring. This pattern has generally resulted in higher winter and spring rainfalls in southern Australia.

The outlook for Spring is for above average rainfall (205mm) and maximum temperature slightly below average. This outlook, coupled with the excellent soil moisture levels, is likely to produce a very good supply of feed this spring with good opportunities for silage and hay making.

In Memoriam

Hilmer Elsie Ruby Naismith



On the 2nd of June 2016 Bethanga lost another longtime resident. Hilmer Elsie Ruby Northey was born on the 25 July 1923 to Lena & George Northey. She was the youngest of four children having three older brothers Edgar, Stan & Ray.

The family lived on a farm at Koorilla and Hilmer went to Koorilla School riding on her pony. Her pony had a mind of its own and refused to go anywhere else other than to school and back. After leaving school she worked at the Koorilla Post Office and Telephone Exchange and helped out on the farm.

Her favourite hobbies were: Playing tennis, the piano and sing-alongs and outings with her friends. One of her claims to fame was playing tennis with Ken Rosewall.

She met Sam Naismith in the early 1950's. Sam had been born and bred in Melbourne and had been a cook in the Air Force. They were married at the St Augustine's Church in Wodonga on the 10 March 1953. They settled on a piece of land surrounding Bethanga Bay affectionately referred to as White Gate, which they set about farming.

Farming was a hard life in those days, milking 50+ cows morning and night, tending to over 500 sheep, pigs and an eclectic collection of poultry including chooks, ducks, turkeys and geese. Everything on the farm had a purpose, usually food for the table or income to sustain the family. When Sam passed away in 1971 Hilmer continued to run the farm and raise their 4 children.

Hilmer always found time to help out at Bethanga Primary, the CWA and the Red Cross. She even found time to take up other social and sporting pursuits. These included golf, fishing, darts and supporting the Bethanga Saints football team. In later life these pursuits were replaced by playing cards, completing Crossword puzzles, reading newspapers and listening to the radio.

Hilmer actively ran the farm on her own into her 80s living at White Gate for 61 years, by herself for the last 32. She never wanted to leave but moved to Westmont for her last months. She is survived by 4 children, 10 grandchildren and an ever increasing number of great grandchildren.

WHAT HAPPENED AT THE COUNCIL MEETING IN AUGUST?

A summary of issues considered at the Council meeting held on 2 August 2016 in Corryong is provided below:

SES Funding – Council resolved to reinstate funding to the three SES units within the Shire for a period of three months up to a total combined value of \$8,085 and to continue to lobby the State for an adequate funding model for SES services.

Council's inability to provide ongoing financial support to SES units is due to the financial environment it is operating in and not a reflection of the value Council places on the SES.

Council formally acknowledged the work of the local SES units and expressed their appreciation for the service provided to the communities of Towong Shire and passed on their appreciation to the members of each unit for their valuable assistance in emergency and non-emergency situations.

Adoption of Council Budget 2016/17 –The Budget establishes the financial framework of Council including income and expenditure, rating strategy, borrowings and asset management programs necessary for Council operations. The 2016/17 budget seeks to deliver a range of key projects for the community, including (but not limited to):

- Seeking external funding to implement the Master Plan for our Upper Murray communities – Upper Murray 2030 Vision Plan
- Implementing Destination Tallangatta projects including upgrades to the Tallangatta foreshore, Tallangatta Holiday Park and Towong Street
- Continuing to implement our Town Beautification Program throughout the Shire
- Upgrading of the Corryong airport precinct in partnership with the State Government

BERRINGA CERT

At the CERT AGM I give a breakdown of CERT callout statistics for the year. While I was preparing the data, I came across a summary that Jacki Eckert, the previous Team Leader gave at the 2013 AGM. It still pretty much covers a year of CERT. I have updated it to reflect the last three years.

To date Berringa CERT has responded to 352 triple zero calls for help within our community; the closest being next door to the rostered driver in Bellbridge, the farthest being Bullioh and Thologolong and we have been to all points in between.

We have helped you, the community members of our peninsula, in falls, cuts, fractures, cardiac arrests, car crashes, motor bike crashes, pushbike crashes, fights, mental health crises, cut fingers, cut arteries, burns, anxiety attacks, asthma attacks, croup, fits, sprains, strains, breaks, imminent birth, imminent death, angina, stroke, blood noses, gastro, overdose, respiratory distress, snakebite, drowning and pain management.

We have climbed into cars, down banks, up hills, through scrub, trees and fences, into sheep yards, hay sheds and paddocks. We have been in your lounge rooms, bedrooms, kitchens, back yards, bathrooms, hallways and sheds. We have driven into multiple driveways and paddocks and done many km on bush tracks and lonely roads. We have dodged your dogs, horses, sheep, cows, spouses, family members, neighbours and kids.

We have turned out in all hours of the day and night and on all days of the week. We have worked with paramedics, MICA paramedics, Ambulance Community Officers, NSW paramedics, Vic and NSW Police, SES, CFA and members of the community.

We have applied cervical collars, splints, bandages, band aids and dressings, given you aspirin, penthrane, ventolin, anginine, adrenaline, oxygen and glucose. We have rubbed your backs, held your hands, elevated your limbs, cut off bits of clothing, sat you up and laid you down. We have checked your pulse, your breathing, your blood pressure, blood sugar levels, temperature, oxygen saturation and your conscious state. We have picked you up off the ground, extricated you from cars, fences, bed sheets, cattle yards and garden beds.

We have laughed with you, cried with you, made you cups of tea, found your pills, packed bags for hospital, locked up chooks and dogs, opened gates, closed gates, locked houses, left messages, completed your footy tips and turned off the lights.

We have completed a basic training program and attend 21 hours of ongoing training every year. We have discussed and dissected each job to learn from it. We have laughed till it hurt and been brought to silence by tragedy. We share a desire to help our community, a willingness to be involved and a great team spirit.

And that pretty much covers it...

We are pleased that we have four new members who have completed their training and once they have their uniforms, will join the 11 current members on the road.



INCIDENTS

16 June, 9:48am - Chimney fire Bellbridge, seven members responded with the slip-on and Tanker 1. The fire self-extinguished. The brigade inspected the roof space and returned after a short time.

26 June, 3:19am - Search and Rescue on Sirls Road. Four members responded in Tanker 1 and private units to help search for a missing hunter. Wodonga CFA responded with three members as well as a thermal imaging camera. Members

assisted Tallangatta SES and Police to search, locate and stretcher out on foot the injured hunter to the waiting Ambulance. Members returned home at 7:20am.

NEW ULTRA-LIGHT TANKER FOR BELLBRIDGE

The brigade was successful in its application for an Ultra-Light Tanker under the Victorian Emergency Services Equipment Program (VESEP). This government funded program is designed to help emergency organisations purchase equipment that is normally beyond their financial means. The brigade had unsuccessfully applied for the grant in previous years so its persistence has paid off. The new Ultra-Light Tanker will replace the aging second hand unit stationed at Bellbridge. The new unit will be purpose built and will be delivered within the next 12 months. The total cost of the unit is \$116,000 of which the brigade had to contribute \$17,333. The brigade has these funds available derived from many years of public donations and brigade fundraisers. We thank all the people that have donated to the brigade over these years to help achieve this great outcome for the brigade and community.

BUSINESS AS USUAL FOR BRIGADE

Over the past months there has been an upheaval between CFA, the United Firefighters Union and the Victorian Government. We do not know how this will affect CFA in the future but we wish to reassure residents that nothing has changed in the way we provide assis-

tance to the community. Our brigade and its members are focused on keeping our community safe as has been the case for over 75 years.

SMOKE ALARM LIFE SPAN

Both hard-wired (mains powered, 240 volt) and battery operated smoke alarms are manufactured to a standard (AS 3786) which specifies an effective life of 10 years. After that time smoke alarms may malfunction and their efficiency may be compromised. As they are an important safety item, we strongly recommend they be replaced every 10 years. You can now purchase smoke alarms with an inbuilt lithium battery that lasts for 10 years without replacement. These are available at hardware stores (e.g. Bunnings) from \$39. These units still require regular testing and cleaning.

If you are not able to afford the cost of the smoke alarms please contact our community safety officer as the brigade can access, for a short time, a small number of units for needy residents. Smoke alarm information will be placed at Bethanga and Bellbridge stores.

Remember ONLY WORKING SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES.
