

After a highly successful Summer Market, producers have been busying themselves in preparation for the Autumn Market to be held on Sunday March 7th at the Talgarno Hall/tennis courts, 9am-12pm. The subsequent Winter and Spring Markets will take place at Bellbridge and Granya.

The first ever Peninsula Seasonal Market, held in Bethanga in early December surpassed all expectations. Over 30 local stall holders ran stalls with products and services ranging from jewellery, clothing, floral arrangements, photography, pottery, natural dyed fabrics, timber wares, original children's books, fruit and vegetables, jams and baked goods, plants and seedlings, a community BBQ, a pop-up coffee shop and a local band.

Conservatively, at least 500 attended the markets, with many locals relishing the chance to catch-up after lockdown and border closures. Local stall holder and organiser Jess Gray was amazed by the day, "I was blown away by all the people who came out! Such a great community gathering with fantastic stalls."

In addition to the many who travelled from Albury-Wodonga, there were cases of those coming from further afield. This included a mother, from Canberra and her son, from Melbourne, who met for a long awaited catchup in Wodonga. They ventured out to Bethanga for the first time, after hearing of the market the day before!

The Autumn Market will be held at the Talgarno tennis courts and Hall on Sunday March 7, 9am-12pm. The wide range of stall holders is set to return, along with a

few new stalls and an extra coffee van. The CFA will be running the BBQ, with a breakfast option before 10am and the Talgarno Primary School will sell drinks and icy poles.

The Berringa Peninsula Community Network, Creek Clay, and Creations by Cooper will be among the stall holders at the Autumn Market.

The Berringa Peninsula Community Network Group has formed in response to the recovery program initiated by the Towong Shire. Volunteers from the group are keen to reach out to the local community to explain what they do and hear from locals any thoughts they may have on future actions. So, bring plenty of BIG ideas!

Creek Clay is a Talgarno based art studio, where artists come together to create uniquely designed and decorated ceramics. All pottery is fired on-site. This market sees the studio bringing their new range of "Wonky Pots", which potter Lea Casey describes as a "budget range using recycled clay, practice pots and



experimental designs and glaze trials".

Creations by Cooper is a pop-up photo-booth run by the very talented Rachel Cooper. A big hit, with young and

Vale Eileen O'Reilly



Just before Christmas, the Berringa Community lost a very significant lady. Eileen O'Reilly had made a huge impact on our community since she and her husband Phil first arrived in Wises Creek, Talgarno to enjoy their retirement and their dream of a farm life. They arrived in 1988 and Eileen soon joined numerous community groups. She joined CWA where she enjoyed meeting some locals. She joined in lots of CWA activities although she stressed she was not 'arty or crafty' but could certainly organise things and offer support. One such support was teaching knitting at the local primary school. This group allowed Eileen to travel the shire, meeting

more people and learning about the area she lived in. From this, Eileen then became a member of the Women on Farms group which lobbied the government to provide Kindergarten access for remote areas. From this, the Mobile Kinder and then FARMS began providing early childhood education for our farming families. Eileen and Phil then assisted setting up the Wises Creek/Talgarno Landcare Group and continued to be a part of this group up until she left Talgarno in 2011. Eileen was a staunch supporter of St Francis in Bethanga and joined CERT at the age of 73 in 2007, retiring in 2010.

Unfortunately, Phil passed away in in 2009, struggling for quite a few years with dementia.

Eileen was also on the Berringa Community News Committee for many years and was our roving reporter, photographer, editor, even using her computer skills to put the newsletter together. She would join in any and all activities organised. One such activity was an Australia Day picnic up at Burrowye where we floated down the river. The first time we did this, we were just stepping out in the river when Eileen informed our group that she could not swim. It was a very nerve-wracking float for some, but Eileen was ecstatic. This is just one example of Eileen's determination and willingness to try anything.

Regular weekly breakfasts were held at Eileen's (Café Eileen). We would walk there, enjoy breakfast and then walk home. One morning we arrived to find a 'Wicked' camper in the driveway and a house load of young Mexican travellers who introduced us to chipotle chilli on our toast for breakfast!! Eileen travelled to Burma with Lea Casey which included a very off-road and nonsanctioned trip to find the place where she grew up. They found it and incredibly met up with her old nanny's daughter. Eileen's sense of adventure never ceased to amaze her friends.

Eileen was aged 86 and will be sadly missed by the community, as well as by her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Bethanga Post Office Robbed, Safe Blown

On the 9th of December two men faced the Wangaratta court charged with robbing the Bethanga post office.

Samuel Butt and James Bartlet pleaded not guilty to the charge of breaking into the Bethanga Post Office and stealing cash from the safe.

Witness statements revealed the men, well known to police, had been planning the robbery for some time and had visited the post office, casing the layout prior to the robbery. Timing of the robbery was strategic to take advantage of the week's takings.

Trial report records show that twenty-four witnesses gave evidence, describing the activities preceding and of the day of the robbery.

Senior Warder W. Clark of Beechworth Gaol deposed that the prisoners had been in gaol for three weeks and during that time had not shaved and consequently their appearance had slightly altered. They had the opportunity to be shaved and had refused.

Stephen Carkeek deposed: I am the manager of the Terminus Hotel in Albury. On the 6^{th of} November I came up from Melbourne by train and saw prisoner Butt in the train at Benalla. He got in the same compartment and said he was going up the line to meet a friend. He had a bicycle with him and said he would stay at my hotel. He came to my place at 12 o'clock and brought the prisoner Bartlett with him. Butt had the bicycle and I noticed a parcel tied under it. It was long and about 2 or 3 inches thick. The jemmy produced could have been contained in it. Both prisoners left without paying their accounts.

Philip Newman deposed: On the 7th of November I saw a man with a bicycle between 7 and half-past. Another man followed and came in for a bottle of beer and took it to the man on the bicycle. I watched the men walk up the hill and when they got there the taller man got on the bicycle and the other man got on behind. There were two parcels on the bicycle.

John Earnest Cummins, a boy 12 years old deposed he was in a paddock halfway between Wodonga and Bethanga and saw two men on a bicycle heading towards Bethanga.

Neddy Wheeler, fisherman at Wodonga deposed he was camped out on the road to Bethanga and saw two men pass on a bicycle between 8 and 9 o'clock. One man was pedalling and the other was standing on the back. They were heading towards Bethanga. Robert D Cole deposed: I am the postmaster and clerk of petty sessions at Bethanga. In the post office there was a small safe that could not be seen from the lobby. I have seen Bartlet three times during the last three months. One time he came to the back door and later that evening he came back saying he wanted to ask me a few favours. While we were talking he was writing in a pocketbook similar to the one produced. He said he was writing replies to my questions. On the evening of 7th November, I locked up the safe which contained postal notes to the value of £24. 2s 5d. Stamps £6. Cash £106 consisting of bank notes, gold and silver. I locked the post office and went to my residence about 20ft away. Next morning the door was open and the safe was gone.

Jos. H. Bracksley deposed: I am a miner at Bethanga and live about 100 yards from the post office. I was up late on Sunday night 7th November. I saw two men in the bright moonlight and watched them for about five minutes. When I checked 2 -3 minutes later they were gone. Afterwards I heard what sounded like a squeaky wheel. After I went to sleep I heard an explosion. Next morning I found a safe with its door blown to atoms and my wheelbarrow nearby.

W. T. Chapel deposed he was going towards Bethanga with a team on the morning of the 8th November and met two men with a bicycle. He recognized one of the men as Butt but could not swear to Bartlett.

The court heard depositions from several more witnesses after which the jury returned a guilty verdict for both prisoners.

Judge Casey summed up describing the men as clever criminals and with the assistance of a bike placed great power in the hands of a burglar and that no counting house in Victoria was safe.

Both men had been convicted of previous crimes resulting in prison sentences. He said "One thing they would find out, they would be more severely punished on every occasion they were brought up".

The sentence of the court is they be each imprisoned for 8 years with hard labour.

Of course, with the event being cancelled, this did not eventuate.

An update from the Bethanga Police Station

Hello all and I hope everyone is doing OK through these trying COVID times.

First of all, I would like to apologise for my absence through the January period. Unfortunately I was called upon to help out with the border closures and spent the majority of my time in Wodonga. Fingers crossed we have seen the worst of these times and I can once again concentrate on keeping the community safe.

One of my focuses when I started here was to get on top of hoon driving. I had several complaints of motorists speeding and performing burnouts on local reserves. In response to this I put together an operation where I employed the services of Wodonga Highway Patrol and other Police officers from surrounding towns. I had a blitz on visiting members of the public. As a result of this operation, we handed out a range of fines which ranged from speeding drivers, unlicensed drivers, overloaded vehicles, unregistered vehicles and unroadworthy vehicles. I am pleased to say all offenders were from out of town. Since this operation I have noticed a decline in erratic driving behaviour.

In my short time here, I have done over 300 breath tests and removed 2 drink drivers from our roads.

General crime in the area has been minimal. Over February I have had 1 case of a theft from a motor vehicle in the Bellbridge area. A spate of thefts from cars occurred in Tallangatta over January where numerous items were stolen from unlocked vehicles. It appears offenders have come in from out of town, stolen items and left. If I could please ask residents to be mindful of securing vehicles and make sure valuables are kept out of sight. The last thing we want is our towns to be known as a place of easy pickings for crooks. I look forward to getting around the community and meeting more residents over the next few months. I am happy to be involved with community meetings or upcoming events, so please do not hesitate to get in contact with me.

Thank you for your support in welcoming me into the area. It has been overwhelming.

The Rotary Club of Bellbridge Lake Hume, in conjunction with Towong Shire Council, conducted the Australia Day awards on an historic wet day. After the hearty traditional free breakfast, MC Rob Lees welcomed everybody by acknowledging the traditional custodians of the land on which we gathered. The Naval Cadets were then invited to carry out the Flag Raising Ceremony.



Rob Lees introduced the guest speaker Sub Lieutenant Australian Naval Cadet, Amanda Thomas and gave a short history of Amanda's background and career. Amanda was born in Finley and from a young age had an interest in joining the services. She enlisted in 1999 in the Royal Australian Navy as a Boatswain's Mate. and then announced the dual Citizen of the Year 2021 Awards.



The second joint recipient of the Berringa Community Citizen of the Year was David Parker, a similar incredibly

community minded person in achieving so much for the benefits of others. David, during the bushfires of 2020 sourced over 400 tool packs to assist farmers and residents who lost sheds and equipment in the fires. He personally delivered the packs and supplies to the people in the affected areas. He is also heavily involved with the Bellbridge Childcare Centre and other community matters. He also has a striking red beard which he shaved off for charity events.

Berringa Peninsula Community Network (BPCN)



The Network aims to support and encourage advancement of the Berringa Peninsula and ensure that in the event of another disaster like the summer of 2019-20, the Berringa community will be in a more prepared and a resilient place with the best chance of safety and positive outcomes for all.

Our Chairman James Filby resigned due to his work and family commitments. Jim de Hennin was elected chair and Stacey Rich deputy chair.

Hall and Recreation Reserve Facilities

Many believe that the Peninsula region was very fortunate not to have had more direct fire impact from the Black Summer Bushfires and have stressed that Jarvis Creek, Mt Granya and Mt Lawson still have heavy fuel loads. Our halls and rec. reserves are natural points for people displaced by fire to seek refuge, information and assistance as was proved during 2020. Many of the Community Halls in the region, including Granya, Bethanga and Talgarno have been putting together grant submissions to improve their facilities. Good ideas have come from each group and therefore a sharing of ideas and pooling of resources might be a way that the BPCN

group could assist the community. In December BPCN arranged a meeting with representatives from Bethanga Hall, Bethanga Recreation Reserve, Hume Boat Club, Granya Hall and Talgarno Hall and the Bethanga, Granya and Talgarno CFAs

Following this meeting, with funding from Bushfire Recovery Victoria, we have engaged Ben King, an engineer with consultants AKPS to assess the condition of the halls. His reports will provide support for funding either as a joint application or for the individual halls.

Bushfire Preparedness Surveys

We think the area we live in is pretty unique and that the way our communities respond to emergencies would also be unique. Recently, the network sent out a postcard survey asking residents what would have made them feel better prepared for the bushfires the region experienced in 2020. The information we received highlighted the resources the people who responded thought would have helped. We now need to find out how important the rest of the community thinks those resources are, and which ones are a priority. The network will be holding a stall at the upcoming Peninsula Market in Talgarno on the 7th of March. We would really appreciate you dropping by to take a look at the list of resources we have

produced and rank them in order of importance to you. Once we understand what the community's priorities are, our network can begin looking for ways to obtain those resources. You will also have the opportunity to add any ideas you may have. If you have a few minutes spare to help us out, you will go into a draw to win a great prize on the day. 
Prospects for the Season Ahead

Rainfall Round-up


The La Niña delivered this summer as BOM had forecast. In an average year, the summer rainfall (November to end January) would be 150 mm. This year it was 201 mm at TAFCO station (de Hennin's), 241 mm at Hume Reservoir and 214 mm at my place. The Hume reading was 161% of average (150 mm).



Almost all of the above average rainfall fell in January with the 114 mm at Hume Reservoir being about the 92nd percentile (92% of all other years since 1922 have had less rain in January). All this rain was the result of lots of moisture being available from the north (because of warm seas) and suitable rainfall triggers such as cold fronts not being blocked by high pressure systems and hence meeting up with moist air over Victoria.

Overall, 2020 turned out to be one of the better years for a long time as everybody has been commenting. Although the total was not huge (there were five years wetter than this since 2000) it was set up by an early autumn break (280 mm in March and April), a mild winter, a top up in August (95 mm) and close to average rainfall the rest of the year. At Hume Reservoir the total was 782 mm, 708 mm at de Hennin's and 786 mm at Carinya.


The rolling 12-month total rainfall has gone from 430 mm last February to 853 mm now. This has meant that my safe stocking rate (without feeding out) has gone from about 9 DSE/ha to about 17 DSE/ha.



Prospects for autumn

Although the La Niña is still with us it has passed its peak and is now weakening and is expected to return to neutral conditions by May. The Indian Ocean Dipole doesn't have much effect over autumn so it can be ignored. Six out of 12 models analysed by Agriculture Victoria expect wetter than average conditions for the next 3 months, 3 wetter to neutral and 3 neutral. Looking at the next 4 - 6months, a majority of models are suggesting neither wetter nor drier than average.

The BOM expects that it is likely that the March to April rainfall will be above the median (about 125 mm). Fingers crossed we may have an early autumn break.

In August 2020, Towong Shire Council was successful in its application to take part in the Working for Victoria scheme, keeping more Victorians employed during COVID-19.

Under Working for Victoria, the Council provided jobs for unemployed people – whether they lost their jobs due to the impacts of COVID-19 or have been without work for a longer period of time.

The State Government initiative made way for 18 new six-month fixed term roles at Towong Shire Council. Seven of those roles were Outdoor Crew and have included an Outdoor Team Leader, Crew Leader plus Outdoor Parks and Gardens crew members.

Since coming on board, the Working for Victoria Outdoor Crew have been busy on a number of projects, including planting over 300 trees in Bethanga as part of the Bethanga Streetscape Project, restoring picnic tables and seating along the Tallangatta Foreshore and cleaning up the Corryong Saleyards.

Mayor Wortmann thanked the Working for Victoria Outdoor Crew for their important work within our community.

"The Working for Victoria Outdoor Crew are integral in helping us bring larger projects like the Bethanga Streetscape Tree Planting to life, as well as ongoing maintenance to improve the amenities of our beautiful Shire."

THE search is on for regular people in the community to become good Samaritans and help to save a life while they're at it. Ambulance Victoria is asking people to download the GoodSAM app which will notify them if someone has suffered a cardiac arrest and their location

Responders will also be given the location of the nearest available defibrillator so they can start CPR immediately before an ambulance arrives. You do not need to be a paramedic or medically qualified to make a difference and you can choose when you want to accept an alert, so there is no pressure to always respond.

Many people do not know that they no longer need to do mouth to mouth resuscitation or know CPR to be a heart starter.

All you need to do is be willing and able to help a neighbour in need with hands-only CPR.

Ambulance Victoria is aiming to recruit an extra 5000 GoodSAM responders and be there in the critical moments when someone needs lifesaving support.

Every day 18 Victorian hearts stop beating and urgently need care to get them going again. The free GoodSAM app is available Google Play and via the App Store



Quick Updates

Training: We have yet to commence training due the ever-changing COVID restrictions hampering our efforts. We are hoping that the year ahead will see a little more stability and allow us to recommence **80th year anniversary:** We are hoping to hold this in 2021, which will be our 81st year anniversary! We have applied for a grant through the Towong Shire to help with the running of this to keep costs down for members to attend and will be making announcements about dates as soon as we hear about the grant application and COVID restrictions allow.

BBQs and Shelter







Simon Feillafe has been busy as usual and organized the collection and distribution of four spring active dung beetle colonies which have the potential to fill a gap in the dung beetle calendar. The plan is to breed these up and then distribute them to interested members of our landcare group.

Simon and Irene Lewis in the Mitta Valley Landcare group have been successful in winning a major grant to breed up and expand dung beetle numbers across their district and this will add to the dung beetle population in our region. Whilst we have not had any official notice, it appears that we were unsuccessful in our application for a similar grant for Balanced Farming. So back to the drawing board for that topic.

Our group joined with the others in the region to support the formation of Mitta to Murray Landcare Inc (MtoM) and we are currently applying for a grant to support Simon as our Landcare Facilitator under the Victorian Landcare Facilitator Program for the next three years. We are confident that MtoM will prove to be of great assistance to our group as well as others in the region.
