Working dog School

Talgarno played host to a different kind of school on Saturday 23rd September this year. The Green family generously provided their time, home and property (including sheep) as the working dog school grounds. Well known trainer Gary White was head teacher with 40 humans and around 15 dogs coming to learn and observe this unique craft.

The dog school encourages dog handlers to train their dogs in a safe, controlled environment. "We are big on animal welfare and these clinics teach the handlers how to work stock with less pressure, noise and everyone's (sheep, dog and human) safety in mind" Jono Green commented.

The event was coordinated and funded by Red Cross as an opportunity to create social engagement and to connect with people within rural communities through an activity of interest. Funding for the event was part of the recovery response to the 2019-2020 fires. Red Cross staff were in attendance to offer advice and support in planning for fires.

The Talgarno Primary School parent committee did a fantastic job catering the event, and no one left hungry.

Karen Green commented that "it was an absolute privilege to host this in our region as Gary is a multi-Australian champion dog trialer and runs these clinics all over the world".

The community can look forward to further working dog schools as the Green's will be hosting Gary White for a two-day clinic in May 2024.









A Visit to Remember

As a core part of our Australian history and traditions, it's never too early to engage with Remembrance Day. A simple poppy worn, a gentle story or a handshake from a soldier was just enough for the children at Bellbridge Early Learning Years Centre (BELYC).

Remembrance Day 2023 at BELYC was marked with a visit from Officers from the Army Logistic Training Centre, Bandiana. Major (MAJ) Mark Robinson and Captain Paras Lohani wowed the children by rolling into the car park in a camouflage G-Wagon, taking a knee and introducing themselves to the children. From there, the children were able to explore the vehicle, ask questions and learn a little about what soldiers do.

"They loved it," BELYC Team Leader Janet Langdon said.

"I loved seeing the kids' faces when the truck rolled up and then when Paras bent down, talking to the children, it was just brilliant." Once back in the new outdoor area, MAJ Robinson read "Lest We forget" by Kerry Brown, provided by Kinder Educator, Cathy Cooke. The picture book aims to explain the feelings around Remembrance Day in terms a child can understand and relate to.

Before the Officers departed, they were presented with two handcrafted poppy wreaths from the children, which they humbly accepted.

"We pause and reflect on the day of Remembrance Day, but it's another to actually pass the torch to those that come after us," MAJ Robinson said.

"It's very encouraging to see that strength coming through to support the soldiers that support them."

With several Defence families attending BELYC, the centre hopes to welcome more visits from soldiers on special days like Remembrance Day and Anzac Day.





The Way We Were - Les Cole

I hope this story brings back memories of a time past to some of our local readers, written by Janet Floyd after a visit to Les Cole, before he moved to Melbourne.

LES Cole

Leslie William Cole was born in January 1920 in Albury, the first child of William James Cole and Gwendoline Fair. Les spent most of his childhood living with his grandparents in Bethanga, Victoria. In 1934 when he finished school, Les moved into Wodonga.

His first job was at Mates timber yard. He later worked for Mylons of Wodonga driving taxis and buses. In 1939 after completing militia training, Les applied to enlist with the RAAF and eventually trained as an aircraft mechanic. He was posted to the 6 th Squadron, serving in Port Moresby, Milne Bay and Goodenough Island before returning to the RAAF base in Sale, Victoria. On discharge. Les returned to Wodonga and resumed working with Mylons. After a range of jobs, Les and his wife Lorna operated a shop in Ariel Street and he was

involved in a confectionary company which was eventually bought out by Red Tulip.

In the community, Les was a founding member of Wodonga Lions Club. He also joined the Civil Defence which was a predecessor off the SES. He became the Communications Officer and trained other members. Les became the first controller of the Wodonga Branch of the State Emergency Service, a position he held for 17 years. The new SES headquarters was named in his honour. In retirement he also worked as a volunteer community driver. Les was also named Wodonga Citizen of the Year in 1984

Les continued living in Wodonga until the age of 103 in 2023, when he moved to Melbourne to be closer to his children.

He gave us a Shoe Horn from Dalgliesh Brothers Shoe Warehouse, which was opposite the Shire Hall in High Street, Wodonga and opened in October 1926. Do you have any more information about this business? We would love to add to our Victorian Collections site.

News from Talgarno Recreation Reserve Committee of Management (CoM)

It's been a busy time at the Recreation Reserve. We are finally starting to see things progressing on many fronts. The Three Halls project is at last underway and insulation has been installed in the roof. The kitchen has been gutted and given a new vinyl floor in preparation for its reincarnation as a commercial kitchen/small meeting room. The gas bottle storage has been re-located to allow installation of solar batteries. A site has been prepared for the water tank adjacent to the shelter with the tank to be installed in early December. All the remaining works are to be completed by the end of February.

The playground has been improved by the removal of the dangerous soft-fall edging and the relocation of the concord.

Don and Marita Elliot gave the Committee the opportunity to cater for their well-attended clearing sale with many in the community donating cakes, slices, sandwiches and their time making this a great fundraiser. Along with generous donations from Peter Ruaro and the Elliots, this raised over \$1000.

The Hypnosis night organised by the fund-raising subcommittee was supported by many community members and was a great success exposing talents that had previously been hidden in our midst. It raised over \$700 thanks to generous donations of food and services from the community and the hypnotist! The CoM has decided that it will devote funds raised at these two events to construct a rock wall surrounding the fire pit at the shelter.

The tennis courts are getting extensive use and the lighting issues which caused frustration are now largely overcome. The tennis club is still in the process of deciding what they want done about the club-house which was flooded as a result of the project. There are still a few issues remaining including the holes at the bottom of the fence and the tennis club is waiting for these to be resolved.

Towong Shire has indicated that they would like to see public toilets located on the reserve and the CoM will shortly be seeking the views of the community in this regard.

Fire Restrictions announced for the Towong shire

The Fire Danger Period began on Monday, 27 November "As we head into summer, fuel loads are becoming for Towong Shire

The El Niño weather pattern means Victorians can expect a hotter and drier summer than recent years, and communities should begin preparing their properties and creating a Bushfire Survival Plan.

CFA Deputy Chief Officer North East Ross Sullivan said across the region we are seeing grass dry out significantly, with vegetation now presenting a yellow colour, indicating an increased fire risk to North East communities.

greater, so we are asking residents to clean up their properties," DCO Sullivan said.

"All it takes is some basic maintenance such as clearing your gutters, picking up loose leaves and twigs, pruning tree branches so they aren't overhanging the roof of your property, or even just keeping your lawn under 10cm tall.

"While CFA's 52,000 members are poised to respond and support communities this bushfire season, they're urging people to use common sense and take responsibility for preventing fires.

Berringa Peninsula Community Network (BPCN)



BPCN has completed its third year.

Here is the report card on our achievements this year.

The BPCN invited community groups, local businesses, and community members to get together on 7 November 2022 at Bethanga

Hall to find out what events or projects are planned that could benefit from some financial support and uncover ideas for new opportunities to build or bring the community together.

Around 40 participants representing the five communities and 15 community groups attended along with a representative from Emergency Recovery Victoria and three from Towong Shire Council.

The following Ideas were also put forward and actioned.

- Bush dance held in February funded by Towong Shire Council
- Community Christmas trees The Lake Hume Rotary Club agreed to donate Christmas trees for each community, but wet weather prevented access to their trees. Towong Shire sourced alternative suppliers.
- Peninsula Market support acts funded by a Towong Shire grant
- Bellbridge walking track upgrades carried out by Towong Shire

Currently being actioned

- Mower and trailer available for use by multiple community groups - a potential funding source has been identified. BPCN is working with interested groups to scope the requirements.
- Mental health project building capacity in the community through training accidental counsellors, potentially to be linked with suicide awareness, mental health first aid and Men's Shed – Red cross will run workshop in the new year
- Arts and history working with local groups to advance ideas
- Activities calendar, community noticeboard, information brochures, community website – currently being developed potentially as online presence and welcome pack for new residents.

Ideas still on the watch list

- · Boat club get-together
- Bethanga to Bay walking track
- Bethanga Recreation reserve facilities upgrade
- Interpretive signage for Bethanga

Grants

After the presentation BPCN was allocated \$10,000 of Emergency Recovery Victoria (ERV) funding to support local events that encourage community connectedness

and social cohesion. In February 2023 community groups were invited to apply for a grant. BPCN received applications from 8 groups for 11 events with a combined cost of \$33,359 and allocated \$21,964.

We allocated \$9140 to 8 events and all but one has happened.

- Talgarno Tennis Club, Come and Try Day and 8-week adult coaching program in September.
- Bethanga Tennis Club, Smash, Bash & Sizzle Come try day in April 2023.
- Bethanga & District Golf Club, High Tea, Hats and Hits Twilight Golf 2023 May 2023.
- Granya CFA, Community BBQ mid-month Saturdays ongoing
- Bethanga Primary School, Bethanga Primary School Art Show August 2023
- Talgarno Recreation Reserve Mothers' Day sip & paint high tea in May, Kids Disco night in September, Community trivia night still to be held.

ERV allocated additional funding for events to be determined by the Upper Murray CRC Chairs committee. Two grant applicants were successfully referred by BPCN

- Rotary Club of Bellbridge Lake Hume applied for funding to enhance the annual Bellbridge Carols by Candlelight in December
- A joint application from the three Berringa Peninsula Cemeteries – Bethanga, Granya and Talgarno for Events to be held in autumn 2024 that celebrate the history and heritage of our area

In January we became an incorporated association which enables us to auspice organisations seeking funding

Community Emergency Management Plans

BPCN is coordinating the development of individual community emergency management plans for Bellbridge, Bethanga, Granya/Bungil and Talgarno. Plans will cover fire preparedness; storms and flooding; community and personal disasters.



Rainfall Round-up

BOM expected that we would get less than average rainfall over spring and they got it right.


The historical median rainfall for Spring (Sep - Nov) is 161 mm. The actual rainfall (up to November 21) for Hume Reservoir was 106 mm, or 66% of median. Jim & Julie de Hennin had 99 mm and we had 84mm. The September rainfall of 8 mm was the driest since 1946 and close to the driest on record which was 5.4 mm. The low rainfall was the result of persistent high pressure areas across Victoria blocking any rain-bearing fronts. This weather pattern was driven by the El Niño and the positive Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) that developed as predicted.



The rolling 12- month rainfall has fallen dramatically to 661 mm and our dream run of high rainfall has ended. The rolling 12-month rainfall at Carinya is shown below.

Prospects for Summer (December to end February)

The current El Niño event is expected to continue until April at a moderate strength. In the Indian Ocean, the IOD is strongly positive but expected to end by December. BOM forecasts that much of Australia will be drier than usual but that rainfall in our part of the country will be very close to normal, around 130 mm over the three months. Days and nights are likely to be hotter than normal over this summer.



Five out of 12 models reviewed by Dale Grey indicate drier conditions between November and January.



September was not only dry but about 4 degrees warmer than normal. Global warming continues and worldwide sea temperatures have been the highest on record for the past 6 months. This is leading to an increase in extreme heat and more of our rainfall coming from short duration, high intensity storms.



Overall, it's a better forecast for us than expected.

Annual Report 2022/23

From the Mayor

It is with great pleasure and a sense of accomplishment that I present to you the Towong Shire Council Annual Report for 2022/23.

I am immensely proud of the progress we have made over the past year. The dedication and collaborative spirit of our Council has paved the way for achievements that benefit our communities every day.

This year has been marked by the continued delivery of an expansive capital works program. We were pleased to commence works on a number of significant projects, some of which will span multiple years:

- · Corryong Saleyards redevelopment
- · Heavy Vehicle Bypass upgrade (Corryong)
- · Revitalisation of Hanson Street and the Corryong CBD
- · Bellbridge Walking Track and Exercise Equipment
- · Mitta Mitta Streetscape upgrades
- · Cudgewa Avenue of Honour
- · Corryong Aerodrome 24 hour aviation fuel service
- Wises Creek Road upgrade
- Smythe's Road and Little Snowy Creek bridge upgrades (Eskdale)

With our eyes firmly on the future, we commenced master planning exercises for Mt Elliot and Lake Hume as well as town-based place making for Bellbridge, Bethanga, Corryong, Mitta Mitta and Tallangatta. We also adopted a number of strategic plans including; Agriculture Strategic Plan, Recreation Strategy and Mobile and Internet Strategy. Collectively, these documents provide us with a clear roadmap of community priorities and also the evidence required to help secure government funding to deliver on these plans.

In the face of multiple emergency and extreme weather events over the last four years we continued to support our communities with a range of recovery services including roadside hubs and rebuild support. In addition, we have continued with our commitment to advocate for better connectivity and were pleased to secure commitment for the construction of phone towers in Burrowye and Koetong.

With a particular focus on families, we saw the delivery of a range of programs and events across the Shire, including an expanded library program, school holiday skill clinics, family movie nights and community walk and talks.

We know that the condition of roads is important to our community. In this financial year we invested \$1.6 million across our 1183km local road network on resurfacing, repairs and general maintenance, and next year we have committed to increasing this to \$1.8 million. However, with flood damage severely impacting the 500km of roads across our Shire managed by VicRoads, we also continued our strong advocacy to state members and ministers for increased spending by the State Government.

In other advocacy campaigns, we travelled to Canberra to meet with federal ministers, Minister Kristy McBain - Minister for Local Government and Regional Development and Minister for Early Childhood Minister Anne Aly. High on the agenda was the need for additional early years services for the Upper Murray and increased funding for road maintenance.

In our pledge to improve communications and customer service we were proud to launch our fortnightly digital newsletter and have also adopted a series of improvements to our customer request system to help us to monitor and respond to community inquires.

In closing, I invite each of you to explore this annual report and celebrate the collective achievements of our community. It is a testament to what we can accomplish when we work together with a shared vision for the future.

This year we commenced construction on the Corryong CBD Streetscape project. Progress moved at a slower pace than we'd hoped in the early stages as we worked to overcome early challenges. The upgrade of the Heavy Vehicle Bypass (Corryong) is close to wrapping up – trucks will be diverted off Hanson Street in 2024! Leslie Norman Eddington

9 June, 1941 - 21 September, 2023



Les was born on 9 June 1941 at the Merri Bek Hospital, Brunswick, to Mona, a florist and Alfred, a butcher. His education began at Essendon Grammar School and continued at Ashby Primary School, Geelong where he became a lifelong 'cat supporter'! Happy family holidays were spent at Granya and the appeal of country life and job

security enticed the 'Eddos' to move there in 1951, in time for the '52 bushfires. Les completed his primary

years at the local primary school with the Stars and the Webbs and Peter Sutherland was a mate when he completed his education at Albury Grammar. Because he boarded at the school through the week, his weekends were spent at Granya fishing, ferreting, shooting, playing footy & tennis and training for athletics which turned him into the well-rounded country lad that we all got to know and love! Partnering Shirley Gadd in the mixed tennis team, resulted in considerable success on the Upper Murray Grand Slam Circuit which included tournaments at Cudgewa, Ournie, Walwa, Jingellic, Guys' Forest, Bungil and Talmalmo!

Les started work with the McCulloch Carrying Company, off-loading goods at Eddie Unger's Walwa Café. He helped supply the locals with some of the '60's essentials - Turf, Craven A, Ready Rub Tobacco and a range of lollies for the kids. The van was the lifeblood of the Upper Murray! Les, however, had bigger plans and in 1964 he was recruited into the Victoria Police Force and began training at the Police Depot in St Kilda Rd. His first

posting was Russell Street, then Moonee Ponds and later he transferred to the Dawson Street Mobile Traffic Section. There he became an instructor at the Car School and later at the Police Motorcycle School. Many rider and mentoring skills were gained here, where he was a member of the Police Precision Motorcycle Show Riding Team. His love of bikes was lifelong!

At this time, Shirley Gadd reappeared on the scene and they were married on August 27, 1966 in Albury. The reception was a splash-up do at The New Albury in the luxurious Windsor Room and the special couple scrubbed up well, Les in the classic svelte dinner suit and Shirl in a beautiful self-designed and made '60's classic daisy-themed frock!

The Eddos set-up house in Oak Park where Shirl continued teaching Domestic Science at Glenroy High School and where they eventually produced their best work, Kelby on August 22,1970 and Davin on 10thAugust, 1972. Planning to move back to the bush, they snapped up a transfer to Wodonga in 1973. Les continued his career in the Mobile Traffic Branch on both family. It was a life well-lived! Relatively recently they bikes and patrol cars.

After 2 years in town, they bought 10 acres on Huon Creek Rd. and built their dream home where the boys had a happy rural childhood with lots of animals, fresh air, space & sport. In 1983 they sold their 'toy farm' and built a new home, 'Bayside' at Bellbridge where they

spent 33 happy years. After 25 years of service in the Police Force and a few back problems, Les decided to resign in 1989 and seek another career, without the limits of shift work. He found a temporary position as a bus driver and supervisor with a sheltered workshop in Albury. A school bus run from Bellbridge to Bethanga, with the bus thrown in, came on the market in 1992 - it was a job made in heaven for Les, which he enjoyed for the rest of his working life.

Life in Bellbridge was wonderful! They became real 'boaties' and were keen sports people and hosts extraordinaire! They loved a night out and were into concerts and ukelele music. Camping regularly with family and friends, they'd get kitted out in the best costumes for all sorts of celebrations and loved polishing up the latest jalopy for the next car rally!

Extensive travel throughout Australia in their caravan and Winnebago as well as internationally, resulted in some amazing experiences, photos and mementos. It was a great life shared with a host of mates and a loving downsized at 42 Golf Links Avenue in town, which was just right and the perfect spot to relax and reminisce about a job well done.

Epidemic Thunderstorm Asthma

People who have asthma or hay fever can get severe asthma symptoms during grass pollen season when high amounts of grass pollen in the air combine with a certain type of thunderstorm. In extreme events, people with no history of asthma may be impacted.

Epidemic thunderstorm asthma is when many people develop asthma symptoms over a short period of time. Whilst these events are uncommon and don't occur every year, they can happen during grass pollen season from October through December. Thunderstorm asthma can affect those with a history of asthma and/or hay fever – especially people who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever.

All people with any risk of thunderstorm asthma should:

- Understand what they can do to help protect themselves during grass pollen season.
- Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October through December especially in the wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows, and if you have your air conditioner on, turn it to recirculate. Have an asthma action plan (if advised to by your GP and developed with them) and know asthma first aid.
- Have appropriate reliever medication available in grass pollen season and be aware of how to use it ideally with a spacer.
- Be alert to and act on the development of asthma symptoms as explained in your asthma action plan if you have one, or if you don't, use asthma first aid.
 Check the epidemic thunderstorm asthma forecast during the grass pollen season at <u>VicEmergency</u>.

The Victorian Virtual Emergency Department

It is a public health service run out of Northern Health in Melbourne for non-life-threatening emergencies.

If you are experiencing symptoms and you think you might need medical attention and your usual GP/health service might be closed or not available rather than call an ambulance or go to the emergency department you can contact VVED. These symptoms might be things like pain, vomiting, urinary infection and influenza.

It is open 24 hours a day with medical reviews offered between 8 am – 11:30 pm 7 days a week, offering full adult and paediatric services.

Defibrillators

Following the CFA donating defibs to the Talgarno Brigade the Talgarno Brigade gave CERT a defib that was purchased with a grant some years ago. In the next few weeks this defib will be installed in the new bus shelter at the end of Wises Creek Road, Talgarno. The CERT committee has purchased another defib that will be presented to the Bethanga Golf Club to be installed to provide 24 hour community access. More details of the location will be provided soon.

There are already 6 public access defibrillators available 24/7 on the Berringa Peninsula They are all registered with 000 through Ambulance Victoria. In the event of a cardiac arrest, 000 operators will advise the caller of the location of the nearest available defibrillator.

Cardiac arrest happens when a person's heart suddenly stops beating and stops pumping blood effectively around the body. It can happen to anyone, anytime, anywhere. Bystanders starting chest compressions or CPR and using an AED can save lives.

Anyone can save a life in three simple steps. Call, Push, Shock: Call Triple Zero (000), Push hard and fast on the middle of the chest, and Shock using an AED.

- Catastrophic For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.

The new Australian Fire Danger Ratings System is now online and we will be using them in the community. Our road signs are updated and will be updated by our members as required.

On Sunday 12 November, the Talgarno Brigade hosted a Community Safety Day for the Peninsula residents. Community residents were presented with information on






